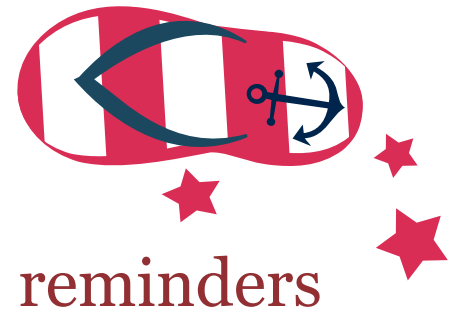

- No chairs or heeled shoes are allowed on the putting green.
- Please feel free to bring a blanket or a lawn chair.
- For your safety, everyone must be near the clubhouse before the fireworks can begin. No exceptions!
- In the event of rain, please be patient. We will make every attempt possible to finish with a bang, however, area storms can sometimes prohibit the firework finish due to sensitive electronic equipment.
- Price for event is all-inclusive, therefore if you are on club property during any part of the celebration you will be charged the published event fee.

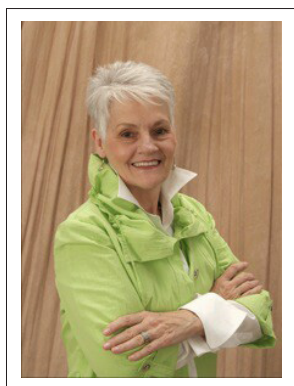

Also, please remember that carts are not to be driven by anyone under the age of 16. Any person operating a golf cart on club property must be old enough to possess a valid driver's license. Caution should be used when driving a golf cart as personal injury to the point of death has occurred, most recently a 37 year old Tennessee woman died after falling off a golf cart in Hilton Head according to the Beaufort County Coroner's Office. The woman was a passenger in a golf cart and fell out striking her head as the driver made a left hand turn. A sad reminder of what can happen if care is not taken.

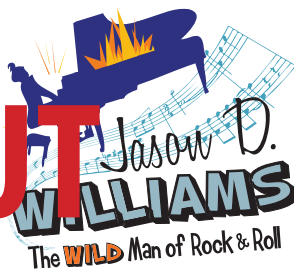

Whether it is on the lake, on the court, playing a round of golf, hiking through the woods or cycling through the hills, you cannot beat the beauty of these surroundings. However, when the temperature rises and humidity soars the summertime heat can be hazardous to our bodies. Excessive heat can potentially lead to life threatening problems such as heat exhaustion or heat stroke.

Heat exhaustion can occur in a person who has been active in a hot, humid environment and is unable to cool themselves sufficiently. Typically, they are dehydrated (through sweating and improper fluid intake) and overheated.

Heat Stroke is a life threatening medical crisis that needs immediate attention. A person experiencing heatstroke or sunstroke has lost the ability to regulate or cool the body's core temperature. Brain, organ damage and even death could result from heatstroke.

The best way to avoid heat related illnesses is to plan your outdoor activities during the cooler times of the day or evening, stay hydrated by ingesting water or similar beverages (without added sugars, caffeine and alcohol) before, during and after activity.

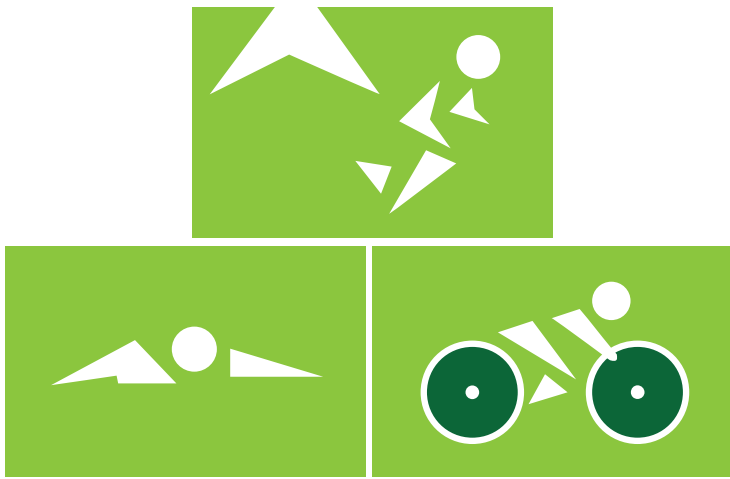
